

Our Goal: to spark collaboration and build relationships while funding organizations serving or advocating for the most vulnerable in our city.


The Incarnate Word Foundation will fund agencies and organizations which:

- Have not been funded by IWF for the last three years in a row.

These funds are to be used for <u>General Operating support</u>. We will not be evaluating applications on a project basis, but rather an overall organization basis.
